NIAAA MMM Program Updates

- Alcohol and pregnancy: Do state-level punitive and supportive policies matter? (R01): Big data study to assess the effects of state-level policies targeting alcohol use during pregnancy. Do effects vary by race/ethnicity/SES?
- CHOICES4Health (2 R01s): Evaluating the efficacy of a technologyenhanced and culturally adapted CDC evidence—based intervention to reduce the risk of alcohol and other substance-exposed pregnancies.
- Native Center for Alcohol Research and Education (P60): Includes 3 intervention research components, one of which is comparing the effectiveness of culturally adapted CHOICES with the effectiveness of the usual care for reducing risky drinking and increasing contraception use among Cheyenne River Sioux women in South Dakota.



NIAAA MMM Future Research and Programs

- Model Continuums of Care Initiative for Women/Girls at Risk and Living with HIV/AIDS (MCCI-A; RFA 2019; Mechanisms TBD): Proposed scale-up of 2 MCCI U34 planning grants (awarded in 2017) supporting community-based participatory (CBPR) implementation research to accelerate community adoption of evidence-based, women and girl-focused, integrated alcohol/HIV interventions. Both projects focus on antiretroviral pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) for women. Scale-up to include counseling re: periconception administration of PrEP for HIV-uninfected partners.
- Model Continuums of Care Initiatives for Women and Families (MCCI; RFI 2019; Mechanisms TBD): Proposed implementation science initiative using community-based participatory research to accelerate community adoption of evidence-based mental health/substance use interventions for women and families. Envisions partnerships with NICHD, NIDA, NIMH, CDC, and SAMHSA.
