**William H. Catherino, M.D., Ph.D. (he/him)**

**Professor and Chair, Research Division of the Department of Gynecological Surgery and Obstetrics, F. Edward Hébert School of Medicine at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences**

Dr. Catherino's research and clinical credentials have allowed him insight into the challenges that many health care professionals face, both in the laboratory and in the clinics. His laboratory research interests focus on understanding the molecular mechanisms of uterine leiomyoma development, a common and highly symptomatic malady in women that results in infertility, miscarriage, and symptoms significant enough to warrant surgical intervention up to 20% of the time.



Dr. Catherino completed medical and graduate school training at the University of Wisconsin–Madison, residency training at Duke University Medical Center, and fellowship training at NIH, where he continues clinical work and maintains fruitful laboratory collaborations. He was board-certified in obstetrics and gynecology in 2005 and in reproductive endocrinology and infertility in 2007. He has been a Boards Examiner for the past 9 years and currently serves as a board member for certification of reproductive endocrinology and infertility practitioners. Dr. Catherino teaches students at the high school level, undergraduates, medical school students, residents, clinical fellows, and postdoctoral fellows, giving both lectures and one-on-one training. He has authored over 100 peer-reviewed manuscripts and over 100 abstracts and chapters. He is the inaugural Editor-in-Chief of *F&S Science*. He has earned continuous grant funding from multiple institutions and cares for a wide array of patients at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center and NIH.
