Dr. Reddy was previously a faculty member at the University of Maryland School of Medicine, a Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Georgetown University, and a Medical Officer at the *Eunice Kennedy Shriver* National Institute of Child Health and Human Development (NICHD).

While at NICHD, she oversaw many influential studies in obstetrics, including directing the Maternal-Fetal Medicine Units Network, which funds multiple clinical trials across the country. Her research on stillbirth, preterm birth, and labor management has had a profound impact on obstetrical practice. She received numerous NIH awards for her role in advancing a women's health research agenda and continues to engage in NIH-funded clinical and translational research at Yale.

Dr. Reddy is widely recognized as a scholar, educator, and mentor. She is a Fellow of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists and has published 250 peer-reviewed articles. She is board-certified in obstetrics and gynecology and maternal-fetal medicine. Her expertise is in the management of high-risk pregnancies, as well as maternal conditions.
