**Judy Regensteiner, Ph.D. (she/her)**

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Dr. Judy Regensteiner's research expertise (R01-funded) is in the cardiovascular effects of diabetes—with a specific focus on women with type 2 diabetes, seeing as they appear to have more significant cardiovascular abnormalities than men with diabetes.

Her lab has been funded for over 20 years, and she has authored more than 150 research publications. She is also known for her research on peripheral arterial disease.

Dr. Regensteiner is currently Principal Investigator for the University of Colorado School of Medicine's program of NIH's Building Interdisciplinary Research Careers in Women's Health (BIRCWH) grant and the Program Director of the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation's Fund to Retain Clinical Scientists. At the Ludeman Family Center for Women's Health Research, Dr. Regensteiner leads an interdisciplinary team of researchers who focus on women's health and sex differences research.
