Dr. Sadovsky's research focuses on fetoplacental development and the molecular function of the trophoblast, which regulate maternal-fetal exchange, immunological defense, and hormone production. His work aims to advance understanding of early human development and pregnancy health.



Dr. Sadovsky received his M.D. from the Hebrew University Hadassah Medical School, followed by OB-GYN residency at Washington University in St. Louis and a maternal-fetal medicine fellowship and postdoctoral research training at the University of California, San Francisco. Dr. Sadovsky is Principal Investigator of several NIH grants. His honors, awards, and service include membership in councils for the *Eunice Kennedy Shriver* National Institute of Child Health and Human Development and the March of Dimes, the NIH Advisory Committee on Research on Women's Health, the National Academy of Medicine, and the Association of American Physicians. He served as President of the Society for Reproductive Investigation and was awarded the 2013 Cozzarelli Prize in biomedical sciences from the National Academy of Sciences.
