#### Monitor Women's Enrollment in NIH-Funded Clinical Research

- In October 2015, GAO released a report titled "Better Oversight Needed to Help Ensure Continued Progress Including Women in Health Research (GAO 16–13):
  - Purposes of the report
  - Five recommendations from the GAO
- NIH officially closed all five recommendations in December 2021 Addressed the final recommendation in the "National Institutes of Health--Report on
  the Advisory Committee on Research on Women's Health: Fiscal Years 2019-2020"
