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Kelly Chandler, Ph.D. (she/her) is a Health Science Policy Analyst in the Office of Research on Women's Health (ORWH). Dr. Chandler coordinates the Congressionally mandated ORWH/IC Directors' Meetings, co-leads the NIH-wide Strategic Plan on Research on the Health of Women, and supports efforts related to science policy for the health of women. Dr. Chandler completed her Ph.D. in Molecular Physiology and Biophysics at Vanderbilt University where her research focused on mapping ancient, long-range enhancers of developmentally regulated genes using comparative genomics and transgenic mouse models. She completed a postdoctoral fellowship at the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency where she was part of the Virtual Embryo and ToxCast teams building predictive models of developmental toxicity. Prior to joining ORWH in 2022, Dr. Chandler was engaged with multiple strategic planning and policy efforts across NIH and HHS and led the interpretation and review of government-wide regulations in the Office of Policy, Planning & Evaluation at the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences (NIEHS).
