Dr. D'Alton is a member of the National Academy of Medicine, and her work to advance education, research, clinical practice, and policy development in women's health has won national recognition. As Co-Chair of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) District II's Safe Motherhood Initiative, Dr. D'Alton has played a pivotal role in the effort to reduce maternal morbidity and mortality in New York state and at a national level.

Honored with a Lifetime Achievement Award by the Society for Maternal-Fetal Medicine, she has served as its President and has held key positions in several professional organizations. The author of or a contributor to over 200 publications, Dr. D'Alton is Co-Editor of *Seminars in Perinatology* and has served on the Editorial Board of ACOG's *Obstetrics & Gynecology*.
