

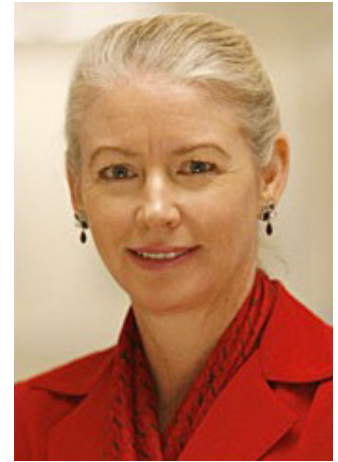

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Dr. Bairey Merz's research interests include women and cardiovascular disease, mental stress and heart disease, the role of exercise and stress management in reversing disease, the role of cholesterol and nutrition management in heart disease, adverse pregnancy outcomes and cardiovascular disease, and precision medicine monitoring to predict unexpected cardiovascular events. She is chair of the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute-sponsored Women's Ischemic Syndrome Evaluation (WISE), which is investigating potential methods for more effective diagnosis and evaluation of ischemic heart disease in women.

Dr. Bairey Merz is a member of the American Heart Association, the American College of Cardiology, the European Society of Cardiology, the Association of American Physicians, and the Food and Drug Administration's Cardiovascular and Renal Drugs Advisory Committee, among other organizations. She has an extensive publication record, with over 450 scientific publications and book chapters and more than 300 abstracts.
