Regine Douthard is Senior Medical Officer in the NIH Office of Research on Women's Health (ORWH) and serves as an advisor to the ORWH Director and senior leadership on women's health and health disparities, global health, environmental and occupational health, and nutrition as those topics pertain to women's health. She serves as ORWH liaison to several NIH-wide and HHS working groups including the NIH Maternal Mortality Taskforce, the Federal Interagency Partners-Federal Cervical Cancer Collaborative, the NIH-wide Climate Change and Health Working Group, and the HHS Maternal Health Agency Priority Goals Working Group



Before joining ORWH, Dr. Douthard served as Medical Officer and Program Officer in several NIH Institutes, Centers, and programs including the National Institute of General Medical Sciences in the Institutional Development Award (IDeA) Program, the IDeA States Pediatric Clinical Trials Network (ISPTN) in the NIH Environmental Influences on Child Health Outcome (ECHO) Program, and the Division of Research Infrastructure within the former NIH National Center for Research Resources.

Dr. Douthard also has considerable global health program management experience including helping to stand up the Presidential Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief, better known as PEPFAR. In this capacity she worked for the Health Resources and Services Administration and in collaboration with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the United States Agency for International Development to implement the program in nine countries across Sub-Saharan Africa and Latin America.
