Dr. Temkin provides clinical expertise on issues related to the health of women. Her clinical research team oversees the Underrepresented, Underserved, and Underreported (U3) Interdisciplinary Research Program; research related to chronic conditions and multimorbidity among women; and research on the multiple biologic, social, and behavioral factors that influence disease risk as well as health outcomes for women.

Dr. Temkin is a gynecologic oncologist who earned her medical doctorate from Georgetown University, completed her residency in obstetrics and gynecology with the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai, and completed a fellowship in gynecologic oncology at the SUNY Downstate Medical Center. She has been active in clinical research throughout her career, having served as an investigator for clinical trials for female-specific malignancies, cancer control, and supportive care for cancer patients. In addition, Dr. Temkin has been recognized for excellence in clinical care as well as her expertise in health disparities.

In addition to serving on faculty at several academic medical schools, Dr. Temkin has served in the National Cancer Institute as a program officer for the Community Oncology Research Program and as a special volunteer for the Division of Cancer Prevention.
